This walk takes place in an area of the County known as the Woolhope Dome. The Woolhope Dome is a rim of hills and folds resulting from the underlying geology of silurian limestone. The limestone rock layer provides beneficial conditions for species-rich grassland, a habitat which isn't widespread in the county as much of Herefordshire lies on old red sandstone. In the centre of the dome of hills lies Woolhope, a quiet, centre of the dome of hills lies woolhope, a quiet, pretty village which has built up around a 12th century church.

Quite a few place in Herefordshire have the word 'Hope' in their name including Sollers Hope, Fownhope and of course Woolhope. The word 'Hope' means a small, enclosed 'blind' valley, and when you look at the hilly landscape in this area it is not surprising that the name appears so often.

Sollers Hope is situated in a perfect example of an enclosed valley and has had a castle, with a church and a later Elizabethan manor house. It's not really a defensive position, which indicates that the castle was more of a manorial residence than a defensive fortress, although there is a deep stream on the west side. Herefordshire's Orchard Heritage


This walk shows off Herefordshire's claim to be "The County of Orchards". Look out for the traditional farmhouse orchards with their regular patterns of mature apple trees displaying mistletoe in winter, sparkling pinky-white flowers in Spring and brightly coloured apples in Autumn. Orchards are also home to a wide range of wildlife including the rare Lessers wide range of wildlife including the care Lesserbotted Woodpecker and iridescent Noble Chafer spotted Woodpecker and iridescent Noble Chafer beetle. See what wildlife you can spot along your walk!

Parking

There is ample parking at the village hall and a few spaces on Broadmoor Common.

Refreshments

Local pubs serve food and a range of locally produced ciders and perry, though many get busy during the summer months so booking may be advisable.
