This grant has been identified as an opportunity for a circuit breaker where funding can be sought to introduce skilled trades people who can have a considerable positive effect on the building's condition and indeed prevent further deterioration through other ancillary works. Furthermore, this is an opportunity for the restoration of historic features within the buildings, which can be repurposed for modern agricultural use.</p>
